

# Inspiring a switch to sustainable and active travel



The eBike Grant Fund supports local authorities, public sector agencies, further and higher education institutions, active travel hubs and community groups to adopt ebikes as a sustainable, active alternatives to car journeys.

## What funding is available?

Transport Scotland have made available **up to £900k** to cover the costs of ebikes, ecargo bikes, ordinary cargo bikes, tandems, trailers, adapted cycles and trikes.

- **Category A:** Up to £25,000 per application towards projects that will provide opportunities to communities to trial ebikes.
- **Category B:** Up to £200,000 per application towards large scale fleets of pool bikes, bikeshare/hire schemes, and promoting large-scale uptake of ebikes.

Applicants can also apply for subsidised access to ebike hire/loan schemes for people with mobility issues, jobseekers, modern apprentices, young people, and students.

## Benefits:

- Improving air quality by encouraging a more sustainable way to travel
- Promoting active travel in communities
- Swapping the car for an ebike boosts heart health
